1. After reviewing your request here are answers to your questions.

a. Does your vaccine order only apply to an FDA approved product?

(1) Food and Drug Administration (FDA) licensed vaccines are the only vaccines that can be mandated for all DoD service members. Further guidance can be found in enclosures (1), (2), (3) and (4).

b. Does your order require the use of any Emergency Use Authorization vaccine?

(1) The order does not require the use of any Emergency Use Authorization (EUA) COVID-19 vaccine. Additional guidance can be found in enclosure (2) and (3).

c. Is the Pfizer EUA-authorized vaccine legally distinct from comirnaty, as stated in the comirnaty FDA Fact Sheet?

(1) The Pfizer COVID-19 vaccines produced prior to and after FDA licensure have the same formulation. Doses of the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine authorized under the FDA EUA may be used interchangeably with doses that have FDA licensure by Pfizer. Additional guidance can be found in enclosures (1) and (4).

d. Does the Navy currently have an FDA approved COVID-19 vaccine product, indicated to be FDA approved in its labeling, that I may use to comply with your order?

(1) Currently the Department of the Navy does not have a FDA approved COVID-19 vaccine product. You are authorized to request a EUA from the Department of the Navy. The Department of the Navy is not included in the World Health Organization Use Listing (e.g., AstraZeneca) in lieu of the Pfizer-BioNTech/Comirnaty vaccine. Further guidance can be found in enclosures (1), (2), (3) and (4).
